Biographical Note

Katherine Goldstein, also known as Katalin or Katharina, was born May 13, 1924, in Budapest, Hungary. In November 1944, she was deported by the Nazis to Kaufering, a subsidiary camp of the Dachau concentration camp in southern Germany. On April 26, 1945, three days before the Americans liberated Dachau, Goldstein and other Dachau inmates were forced to march to Beuerberg. Goldstein was liberated on April 30, 1945, and came to the United States, where she married Arthur Prevost in Staten Island, New York, in 1950.

One image shows Goldstein on the death march to Beuerberg, several days before the liberation of the camp. Also included are images of her husband, Arthur Prevost, and their children, Patti and Roger Prevost.</p>
